RECAP: GREAT LAKES TO GULF WATERSHED LEADERSHIP SUMMIT

The Mississippi and Atchafalaya River Basins (MARB) Watershed Leadership Network hosted a Great Lakes to Gulf Watershed Leadership Summit last week, right here in Long Beach, Mississippi.

Over 50 attendees from throughout the Mississippi River Basin convened at the Gulf Coast. Discussion about successes and challenges of watershed management and leadership allowed for cross-basin learning between state leaders, officials, researchers, farmers, Gulf fisherman, and a local chef.
